Homework

Outdoor Learning

- In line with the school Risk Assessment, we will be taking learning outdoors as much as possible.
- Please ensure your child has a warm, waterproof jacket. They can also take in waterproof trousers and a change of clothes. There are umbrellas and shelters around the school.
- We will not be outside in extreme weather, but a little bit of rain won't stop us!

P.E

- P.E. will take place outdoors until further notice.
- Our P.E. days are Tuesday and Friday.
- Please send your child to school in their P.E. kit on these days.
- Children can bring a change of clothes to change into if they are wet or muddy.

P.E.



- In line with school policy, we are unable to help children remove earrings and they cannot be worn during P.E., even if covered with tape.
- If possible we recommend children do not wear earrings at all on P.E. days as they can get lost.
- Pupils with long hair should bring something to tie their hair up.



Numeracy

- This term we will be focusing on the revision and teaching of:
 - Shape
 - Consolidation of number which will include
 - Rounding
 - Place value
 - Four operations
 - Estimation
 - Written calculations
- The pace will be set by the needs of the children and differentiated appropriately using the challenge by choice approach.



For example:

Mild	Spicy	Hot
Complete mild rounding sheet in jotter. L.I. I can round to the nearest 10 and 100.	Complete spicy rounding sheet in jotter. L.I. I can round to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.	Complete hot rounding sheet in jotter. L.I. I can round any 7 digit number to any given place.
Roll it — nearest 10 game	Roll it — nearest 1000 game	Roll it — nearest 1000 game

Children are encouraged to challenge themselves whilst also building confidence in their skills.

Reading

- Reading for enjoyment-encouraging personal reading at home.
 - Novels/annuals/comics/magazines/audio books etc
- Reading will be linked to Talk4Writing this term and focusing on the skills within reading (e.g. summarising a text, inferential questions, prediction, finding information etc).

Writing

- Spelling strategies, dictionary and thesaurus work, active spelling
- Increasing use of VCOP.
- Talk4Writing develops many writing skills through exploring a variety of genres.
- Extending and revising knowledge of grammar through our Talk4Writing focus -nouns, adjectives, verbs, adverbs and connectives.
- Cross-curricular links
- Handwriting- we will have a weekly handwriting lesson to encourage neat presentation and promote continuous
