- P4 will continue to receive books home and P5 should continue to engage in personal reading at home.

Writing

- Continuing to develop the use of cursive handwriting and presenting our work neatly.
- Poetry, focusing on rhyme and description
- Functional writing through non-chronological reports linked to IDL
- Continue to work on editing and proof-reading skills

- Contributing appropriately and taking notes while listening.
