We ask parents to pay 40p per day for the nursery treat fund. This helps to pay for things such as party food, entertainment and essential items along with snacks and baking ingredients.

Please hand in your contributions to the nursery office.

Parents/carers are welcome to pay this on a weekly, monthly or termly basis.

Nursery Uniforms

Children's poloshirts and sweatshirts can be purchased from Baru in Kirkintilloch. Poloshirts now come in white and navy and sweatshirts in navy blue.

Clothing and Footwear Provision

Please provide a pair of indoor shoes for your child for when we visit the school gym hall. Can we also ask that you provide wellies that can stay in nursery for our many wet weather days. Please ensure your child is suitably clothed for the weather each day as we will be outside on a daily basis.

Please also provide a spare change of clothing for your child. This can be kept in a bag on your child's peg with their name clearly marked. Please label all of your child's belongings. As you can appreciate we have over 100 children and cannot keep track of every child's belongings.



Security

You should all be aware of our signing in and out system as part of our procedures for keeping your child safe. Please ensure you notify the nursery if someone not on your 'authorised to collect' list on your child's enrolment form is coming to collect your child. The person must then quote your chosen password and provide identification on arrival. Once you have collected your child from the playroom and have entered the foyer, please keep your child beside you at all times. At pick up times the foyer can be really busy and the main doors are constantly opening and closing. Please be vigilant in keeping your child safe.

Tempest Photography

Tempest will be visiting on **Thursday 3rd November**. This will be for all our nursery children. You are welcome to bring your child into nursery if it is not their usual session. If your child has an older sibling in the school and you wish them to be photographed together please let the nursery office know so that we can co-ordinate with the school.

Improvement Plan

This year's improvement plan priorities are as follows:

- -improving literacy continuous provision indoors and outdoors
- improving numeracy continuous provision indoors and outdoors
- Improving children's health and wellbeing through all stakeholders implementing the principles of being communication friendly.
- Preparing for the delivery of 1140 hours in August 2020

We will be self-evaluating our progress throughout the year ahead and looking for your input into this.

Outdoor Learning

At the start of each session (approximately 9am and 1.15pm) the children do their 'daily mile'. This gets the children active and ready to learn for the rest of the session. They will be encouraged to walk, run, skip, hop, jump — whatever they choose to do so long as they are moving and having fun! Please note, the only day we do not do the Daily Mile is a Wednesday morning due to assembly and gym hall time.

When we return from doing the Daily Mile the children then have the option of staying outside or going back indoors. The children are free to choose where they play and can move from indoors to outdoors and vice versa independently. We really value outdoor learning and the benefits it brings to a child's whole development and wellbeing.

In order to manage a free flow 'indoors to outdoors' approach we are having to review our current practice. To help it run more smoothly we are now encouraging the children to change into their welly boots and put on a nursery jacket at our outdoor canopy area. When they return indoors all they need to do is get their shoes from the welly tub and hang up their jacket. This saves having to go out and in to the foyer repeatedly.

Also, when your child arrives at nursery please now keep their outdoor shoes on. When they are going outside and require welly boots they can change into them at the canopy area where the welly boots are stored. The outdoor area is open from 8.30am so children arriving after then in the morning have the option of going straight outside or staying inside. The same applies for the afternoon session. The children will change into their indoor shoes when going to the gym hall.

IF YOUR CHILD DOES NOT HAVE WELLY BOOTS AT NURSERY CAN YOU PLEASE PROVIDE A PAIR THAT CAN BE STORED IN THEIR GROUP WELLY TUB WITH THEIR NAME CLEARLY WRITTEN INSIDE. THANK YOU.
