Cold Weather



Please ensure your child comes to nursery with warm clothing and footwear. We go outside daily so it is important that the children are wrapped up warm. Please label all hats, gloves and scarves – as you can imagine keeping track of 90 children's belongings can be rather challenging!

Sickness and Diarrhoea

Please note there is a 48 hour exclusion period for sickness and diarrhoea. The 48 hour period starts from the last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting.

Health and Wellbeing - Physical Activity Programme

The children are thoroughly enjoying their 'Going for Gold' sessions with Fiona on a Wednesday morning. They have been developing their balance, co-ordination and gross motor skills. Fiona and Aimee have also started 'Play on Pedals' sessions with some children. This is a programme designed to teach the children to ride a two wheeler bike.







Nursery : Primary Transition Programme

Our first block of transition visits starts on week commencing 11th November and runs for 2 weeks. The focus for this block is stay and play group visits. Block 2 will take us up until Christmas with an expressive arts focus.

Promoting Literacy at Lenzie Meadow

Nursery Lending Library

Thank you to Kully, Harley's mum, who has kindly agreed to come in each week to organise our Lending Library. We really need another helper (preferably in the afternoon) to make sure that every child is getting the opportunity to take a book home each week. Please let us know if you can spare an hour a week to help us out.

When your child brings a book home we recommend that you spend time with your child reading the book together and completing the book review. Please look after the books and return them back to the nursery with care.

We hope you enjoy this special time with your child. A bedtime story is so valuable for developing your child's literacy skills and to help build their vocabulary. Please spend 10 minutes every night with your child with no distractions and share together the wonder of books.

Listening and Talking Boxes

We will be sending home 'listening and talking boxes' very soon. This is to encourage children's listening and talking skills through the use of a familiar object from home. Instructions will be inside the box along with the learning outcomes associated with this activity.

Talk for Writing and Word Aware

Lenzie Meadow Nursery uses the 'Talk 4 Writing' approach to introduce stories. This enables children to imitate orally the language they need for a particular topic, and then create their own version. The children begin by using sign language to orally retell the story. Children will then have opportunities to engage with the texts through role play and various creative tasks. Following that, the children then have the chance to retell the story and even adapt it to become a new story of their own. This is modelled through the use of story maps. Children who show an interest in mark making will often create story maps of the texts we have covered.

Alongside 'Talk 4 Writing' Lenzie Meadow Nursery are using the 'Word Aware' approach to enhance our Literacy programme and help close the vocabulary gap. Vocabulary is important because it is closely connected with reading and writing. Children need to be able to understand words if they are to develop their understanding of what they read. In the Early Years, children learn the meaning of words by hearing them in sentences. The more times they hear them used by different people at different times, the more children can learn. The nursery and families working together gives children the best chance to learn new words.

Language and Communication Friendly Establishment (LCFE) – talk techniques

This month we are focusing on the following strategies

'Listen more than you talk' - children benefit from being given time to talk and time to respond

'Involve children in conversations' - children feel valued when they are included in conversations

'Use visual cues' – children, particularly those with a communication barrier, benefit from visual cues to support their understanding and making choices

Please remember to read the Nursery: Home Link sheet that is emailed out each month to see how you can support your child's learning at home. Also, we display our talk technique strategies
